MARCH CAMPAIGN

Since 1983, Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches (GMCC) Minnesota FoodShare has coordinated the largest food drive in the state, known as the March Campaign. The March Campaign is an annual effort to increase awareness of hunger in Minnesota and promote donations of food and dollars to local food shelves. Since its beginning, the Campaign has raised 336,900,563 pounds and dollars combined for food shelves across the state.

In addition, Minnesota FoodShare also distributes money to food shelves statewide through their "Food Fund". This fund includes donations FoodShare works to secure year-round from corporations, individuals, foundations and businesses, and 100% of all donations received during March go directly to the fund as well. Since 1992, GMCC MN FoodShare has distributed over \$18,500,000 through "Food Fund".

The "Food Fund" dollars are distributed based on March Campaign participation results and on the number of clients a food shelf serves. Each food shelf reports their March Campaign results and number of clients served to Minnesota FoodShare and those numbers determine the percentage of the available dollars they will receive. The more a food shelf collects during the March Campaign, the more "Food Fund" dollars it will receive from Minnesota FoodShare.

The Red Lake Falls Food Shelf has participated in this campaign for 24 years and is registered again this year to take part in the GMCC Minnesota Foodshare's March Campaign. The GMCC Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign begins March 1, 2024 and ends March 31, 2024. If you would like to make a food or cash donation to the Red Lake Falls Food Shelf, you may drop it off at the Red Lake Falls Food Shelf just down the hall from Thrifty White Drug in Park Place Mall, at St. Joseph Catholic Church, or at St. Joseph Parish Activity Center by March 31, 2024. At this time the RLF Food Shelf could use canned fruits, fruit juices, canned vegetables, soups, crackers, oatmeal, jelly/jam, peanut butter, pasta, spaghetti/tomato sauce, mac and cheese, boxed potatoes, hamburger/tuna helper, tuna, ketchup, pudding, jello, baking supplies-flour, sugar, powdered sugar, brown sugar, baking powder/soda, cake mixes, frosting, vegetable oil, paper products-paper towels, toilet paper, Kleenex, household/hygiene products-dishwashing liquid, laundry detergent, toothpaste, soft toothbrushes, shampoo, and conditioner.

Owner or Steward?

Every animal of the forest is mine.

Today's Scripture & Insight: Psalm 50:7-15

"Am I an owner or a steward?" The CEO of a multibillion-dollar company asked himself that question as he weighed what was best for his family. Concerned about the temptations that can come with vast wealth, he didn't want to burden his heirs with that challenge. So he gave up ownership of his company and placed 100 percent of the voting stock in a trust. Recognizing that everything he owns belongs to God helped him make the decision to allow his family to earn a living in exchange for work while also using future profits to fund Christian ministry.

In <u>Psalm 50:10</u>, God tells His people, "Every animal of the forest is mine, and the cattle on a thousand hills." As the Creator of all things, God owes us nothing and needs nothing from us. "I have no need of a bull from your stall or of goats from your pens," He says (v. 9). He generously provides everything that we have and use as well as the strength and the ability to earn a living. Because He does, as the psalm shows us, He's worthy of our heartfelt worship.

God owns everything. But because of His goodness, He even chose to give Himself, entering into a relationship with any who turn to Him. Jesus "did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). When we value the Giver over the gifts and serve Him with them, we're blessed to delight in Him forever.
